

I have been in many art groups through years in




the years in Memphis, TN, as well as Albuquerque, NM, where I moved in 1997, after a wonderful Taos, NM, visit

I have painted in many mediums. I have a Bachelor of Arts in Printmaking,





although I don't do Printmaking, because I never could afford the \$15,000 price of a printing press. So, I paint in oil, watercolor, alcohol ink, acrylic,











A WARNING shared by APS (Appalachian Pastel Society):

Many artists use social networking to increase the visibility of their work and stimulate sales, especially today with COVID. It is perhaps true that many of us don't read the fine print when posting to these sites.



If you'd like to paint along during this demo here are the supplies we'll be using: Uart sanded paper in your favorite grade (or your own preferred paper) An assortment of NuPastels An assortment of soft pastels in a range of lights and darks, as well as warm and cool colors Backing board Artist tape or clips Charcoal pencil (optional) Spray fixative Pipe insulation or other blending tool


ABSTRACTING THE LANDSCAPE... Getting the Glow!


