24 people attended the Christine Swann portrait workshop which was mind-blowling. Her approach to using pastels is very different and really made sense to many of us. She focuses on the powers of the pastels.

Pastel CATEGORIES:

LOW POWER - all pastel sticks, (no matter what brand) Rembrandts, Nupastels, Creatacolors or any old square grumbachers

MEDIUM POWER -

Giraults, Winsor Newton, Blue Earth, Diane Townsend, Mount Vision, Unisons, Older Richesons or any old round grumbachers,

3/4 POWER- OPTIONAL — Terry Ludwigs, Newer Richesons, Schminckes, Ming Art Pastels

HIGH POWER - Senneliers, Great Americans, Roches



I learned that I prefer high powers which is why I struggle sometimes. As Christine says "if everything is special nothin will be special" Use the high

power for mark making selectively. Low power makes the high power sing!

We spent a good deal of time on the five rules of light. Christine recommended the book "the Classical Atelier" by Juliette Aristedes especially chapter two on composition. We raffled it off to workshop participants and Janet Johnson won it.

Here is my painting from the course. There are other finished paintings on our Facebook page, all very different and wonderful.







a helpful hint....

Want an inexpensive way to transport your artwork and protect it from the heat, moisture and rain while outside or in your vehicle? I can let my painting sit in my car in the sealed pouch without worry about it "cooking" (I live in the central valley of California).






Buy a roll of Reflectix insulation, and selfadhesive foil tape (Lowes or Home Depot), and self-stick velcro tabs.



Make a pouch to fit your painting by folding one edge of the insulation back on itself, with a little extra for a folddown flap. Tape side edges of the





Hint: let the velcro adhesive set for at least 24 hours before opening and closing so it adheres well.


