




I look forward to seeing everyone's work as well as many of your smiling faces at the event, even if it is in a tiny box on my laptop! Good luck and happy painting!







I use an Excel sheet for that. Check the prospectuses CAREFULLY as each show has varying critera.

Best of LUCK submitting! And keep trying. Do not become discouraged .. it takes us all many many times as we learn the ropes. Use your Network of Artists around you. Pastelists are some of the most mutually-supportive and encouraging people I know.

I am Sandra Lo, a pastel and oil painter.



along. That painting and making art is how I can find inner peace.

Painting to me is pure mindfulness. I imagine I am bringing both the past and the future together and into each mark I make. When I make art, I go to a place where I am focused and intent on capturing the





beauty of the world around me. I feel a serene connection to whatever I am painting. I am there. To me, the process is pure joy. Although I am drawing on my knowledge of art theory and

techniques, I feel the presence of something beyond myself. My intuition speaks to me and I find myself choosing a color or making a mark without fear or

worry. This, to me, painting is the highest form of meditation and helps me feel aligned with God. My goal is to bring forth the emotion that initially drew me to the subject. Every painting I make is both a personal learning experience and an expression of my love for the beauty of the little moments of my life. I enjoy capturing the beauty of color found in light and shadow, whether it's a landscape, figure or

still-life. I spend time plein-air painting, but is also inspired by my travels around the country. When I can't be outside, I will be found working in my studio using reference photos of my grandchildren or painting still lifes of freshly cut flowers.

A native of Rockville Maryland, I received my Degree in Art Education from the University of Maryland in 1985. After an award winning career as an Art Educator in Howard County Maryland, I retired in 2019. Since retirement, I have been enjoying being a full time artist and have received awards in several plein-air competitions, as well as acceptance into several national and international shows. I serve on the board and participate in several art organizations from my new home in Clemmons, North Carolina.

My style has changed a bit over the years. At the beginning of my career in pastel painting, I worked very detailed. taking days to complete a piece. Now, after being inspired by the MPS quest demonstrations by Tony Allain and Gail Piazza, my works are completed in just a few hours. Using Tony's quick sharpie sketch technique, then an under-painting using pan pastels, my work has become more spontaneous. Sometimes the under-paintings just need a few touches of pastel sticks for me to feel the piece is complete. I have been experimenting with various surfaces to see which surface works best for my new technique, with favorites being Uart (dark) and Sennelier La Carte.

Color and value Mark making







Construct a portrait over 2 days using Christine's 5-layer technique. Learn the system of finding a likeness quickly with the "Thirds of the Head" methodology. NO more remembering the "math" dividing up the head. It doesn't work—because we are all different! Also lots of info on the structure of the head and what to look for to create a good likeness. Then understanding light and how that helps to convey realism when painting the head. The LAW. The rules. Ever wonder if you have errors in your images from working from photos? Now you will absolutely know...

Then to the good stuff....totally understand the pastel medium. Learn the philosophy of the "Power of Pastel." Take control of this medium and master those dusty sticks. Know when to use which brand. Know which pastels play nice with each other and which do not. You will never look at your sticks the same way again.

Intermediate to Advanced Level. Must already possess a wide variety of pastels. No specific brands needed, just pencils and wide variety of pastels from different companies. (which most pastellists tend to collect!)
